RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING CITY OF MECHANICVILLE CITY COUNCIL AS LEAD AGENCY AND DETERMINING THAT THE ACTION TO CONSTRUCT THE SOUTH CENTRAL DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT IS AN UNLISTED ACTION AND WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT ADVERSE IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Mechanicville (the "City") is proposing the South Central Drainage Improvement Project along South Central Avenue, Main Street, and Green Street in Mechanicville, New York (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, as amended, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and the implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 617 (the "Regulations"), the City desires to comply with the SEQRA and the Regulations with respect to the Project; and

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2018, the City Council passed a resolution to declare their intent to be the SEQRA lead agency for the project and reviewed Part 1 of the Short Environmental Assessment Form (SEAF) prepared by the City relative to the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved the Part 1 SEAF and requested it be sent to other potentially "involved agencies" and "interested agencies" (as these quoted terms are defined in the Regulations), indicating the City of Mechanicville City Council's desire to serve as "Lead Agency" (as this quoted term is defined in the Regulations) and to initiate a coordinated review of the project under the SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, more than thirty (30) days have elapsed and each of the involved agencies or potentially involved agencies has agreed to, or raised no objections to, the City Council serving as Lead Agency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Regulations, the City Council has considered the significance of the potential environmental impacts of the Project by (a) using the criteria specified in Section 617.7 of the Regulations, and (b) examining the SEAF for the Project, including the facts and conclusions on Parts 1, 2, and 3 of the SEAF, together with other available supporting information, to identify the relevant areas of environmental concern, and to determine whether the South Central Drainage Improvement Project will have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed Project will not have a significant effect on the environment, and will not cause a significant impact on the environment, and therefore, the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement is not required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to and in accordance with the coordinated review requirements of SEQRA, that the City of Mechanicville City Council hereby establishes itself as Lead Agency for the Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that based upon an examination of the SEAF and the criteria set forth in 6 NYCRR Part 617, and considering both the magnitude and importance of each relevant area of environmental concern, the City Council makes the following findings and determinations:

- A) the Project constitutes an "Unlisted action" (as the quoted term is defined in the Regulations) and the City Council has conducted a coordinated review;
- B) No potentially significant adverse impacts on the environment are noted on the EAF and none are known to the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that as a consequence of such findings and determinations, and in compliance with the requirements of SEQRA and the Regulations, the City Council directs the City Mayor to file the Negative Declaration notice for the project and keep it readily accessible in the project file; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all subsequent notices and references concerning this project and SEQRA review shall note that the City Council has issued a negative declaration.
