WHEREAS AS WE MOVE INTO THE STRUCTURAL STABILATION AND INITIAL REHABILITATION phase of the project it is necessary that the City retain an engineering firm to assist the City in handling the various aspects of planning and funding administration as the City proceeds forward with the project;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE MECHANICVILLE CITY COUNCIL authorizes the Mayor to sign a contract with Barton & Loguidice, DPC 10 Airline Dr. Albany, NY to perform the planning and project administration/assistance necessary to begin the stabilization of this historic building. The time and expense fee for these services will not exceed \$15,000 without an additional agreement between Barton & Loguidice and the City of Mechanicville . These fees will be paid through the available grant proceeds.

WHEREAS, a Project SOUTH STREET SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS P.I.N. 1758.03 ("the Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ration of 80% Federal funds and 15% non-federal Sate funds (Marchiselli) and 5% local share.

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of Design,

RESOLVED, that the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the City Council with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further
