WHEREAS THE CITY OF MECHANICVILLE (City) has received funding from the NYS EFC Water Improvement Infrastructure Act (WIIA) with a grant of \$153,000 and in-kind contribution of \$102,000 to complete Water Treatment Plant Improvements including new filter media and new VFD drives for filter backwash blowers;
