**WHEREAS**, the City of Mechanicville (City) is proposing the North Main Street Parking Lot Improvements project (Project), located in the City of Mechanicville, Saratoga County, New York; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, as amended, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and the implementing regulations in 6 NYCRR Part 617 (the "Regulations"), the City desires to comply with the SEQRA and the Regulations with respect to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Project has been classified as an "Unlisted Action" as defined by SEQRA in 6 NYCRR Part 617.2; and

WHEREAS, the City has decided to undergo an uncoordinated review under SEORA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Regulations, the City Council has considered the significance of the potential environmental impacts of the Project by; (a) using the criteria specified in Section 617.7 of the Regulations, and (b) examining the Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) for the Project, including the facts and conclusions in Parts 1, 2, and 3 of the FEAF together with other available supporting information to identify the relevant areas of environmental concern, and (c) thoroughly analyzing the identified areas of environmental concern;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

**RESOLVED** that the City Council hereby establishes itself as the Lead Agency for the Project; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that based on examination of the FEAF and other supporting information, and considering both the magnitude and importance of each relevant area of environmental concern, and based further upon the City Council's knowledge of the area surrounding the Project and such further investigation of the Project and its potential environmental impact as the City Council deemed appropriate, the City Council makes the following findings and determinations;

- 1) The Project constitutes an "Unlisted Action" (as the quoted term is defined in the Regulations); and
- 2) No significant adverse environmental impacts are noted on the FEAF for the Project and none are known to the City Council.

Therefore, the City Council hereby determines that the Project will not have a significant adverse environmental impact, and the City Council will not require the preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Statement with respect to the Project; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Mayor of the City of Mechanicville hereby is authorized to sign Part 1 (page 13) and Part 3 of the FEAF and is directed to file a copy of the SEQRA documents in accordance with the Regulations; and
