WHEREAS, the City of Mechanicville City Council (the "City Council") is proposing the Mechanicville Disinfection Byproduct Remediation Project (the "Action"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, as amended, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and the implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 617 (the "Regulations"), the City Council desires to comply with SEQRA and the Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mechanicville City Council is identified as the agency directly undertaking the proposed action, and the City Council is completing an uncoordinated review of the Action under the SEQRA Regulations, as no other "Involved Agencies" (as this term is defined in 6 NYCRR Part 617.2(t)) have been identified; and
