


**Question 1:** How often do you use the Depot Square intersection?


Question 2: What mode of transportation do you primarily use when navigating this intersection?





**Question 6:** What other improvements or changes do you think are necessary at this intersection to make it safer and more efficient?

#### **Summary of Reponses:**

Out of the provided responses, 16 express a desire to avoid or resist change. Comments emphasized the safety and uniqueness of the intersection in its current layout.

Concerns about visibility and sight-distance for vehicles making turning movements around the historic, vacant, train station building.

Responses included

- 1. Make the stop signs larger
- 2. Don't change it. It's been like that forever.
- 3. Can't find improvement plan anywhere
  - Suggestion: Lighting
  - Suggestion: Make it a circle
  - Emphasis on keeping it as it is, or making it a circle

### 4. Leave as is, if it's not broken, don't fix it

- Suggestion: More crosswalks
- Concerns about confusion with stop signs and incoming traffic

#### Not needed

- Strong opposition to any changes, emphasizing the safety and uniqueness of the intersection
- Criticism of the city's priorities and lack of transparency

# 6. Instead of the crosswalk going across Railroad...

- Suggestion: Adjust the crosswalk layout
- Positive experiences as a pedestrian, driver, and cyclist
- Appreciation for the quirkiness of the intersection

## 7. I think there's nothing wrong with the intersection...

- Opposition to changes, citing long-term residence and lack of accidents
- Concerns about potential negative impact on businesses and traffic flow
- Suggestion: Address water infrastructure issues instead

**Question 6:** Are there any specific aesthetic or landscaping changes you would like to see at this intersection?

### **Summary of Reponses:**

- 1. Get rid of scary abandoned building
  - Suggestion: Remove the scary abandoned building
- 2. Trees, All new sidewalks with hard scaping to make it impossible to not follow the new setup.
  - Suggestion: Introduce trees and new sidewalks with hard landscaping to enforce the new setup
- 3. Pedestrian safety and improved traffic control pavement markings
  - Emphasis on pedestrian safety and improved traffic control markings
- 4. A circle with something in the middle
  - Suggestion: Implement a circular design with something in the center
  - Additional suggestion: Use mulch and plants to fill potholes
- 5. Have the building torn down that's boarded up
  - Strong recommendation to demolish the boarded-up building
- 6. Trees greenscape
  - Emphasis on adding trees and greenery to the area
- 7. This project looks like hell and is only going to cause traffic backups
  - Negative feedback on the project, concerns about traffic disruptions
  - Suggestion: Focus on redeveloping the train station
- 8. A sidewalk to encourage walkers to stay away from the building on the corner of N. 2nd since it's a blind right turn. Otherwise, there are no issues.
  - Suggestion: Sidewalk for safety around a blind right turn
  - Focus on promoting zipper merge for S. Central
- 9. The city-owned property needs to be rehabilitated or torn down, or sold to a developer.
  - Strong recommendation for rehabilitation or removal of city-owned property
  - Criticism of neglect in certain areas
- 10. Yeah, knock down that disintegrating train station.
  - Call to demolish the deteriorating train station

#### **Email comments:**

Layout looks good. Turn from 2nd to 3rd is beter defined, as is 2nd to Viall. Stops signs are well placed and in correct locations.

Would like to see better definition of pedesterian walkway on east side of 3rd along side Ugly Rooster parking lots. Student walkers from Jr/Sr School are regularly seen walking on that side of street headed toward Viall. While the "Rooster" is closed for the day about that time it still could use better conditions.

I can't comment about 2nd because it isn't as visible.

Also, consider a speed bump between X/O tower and old train station to slow traffic coming down Viall headed to 3rd. The traffic is fast.
